# Five Year Forecast Financial Report

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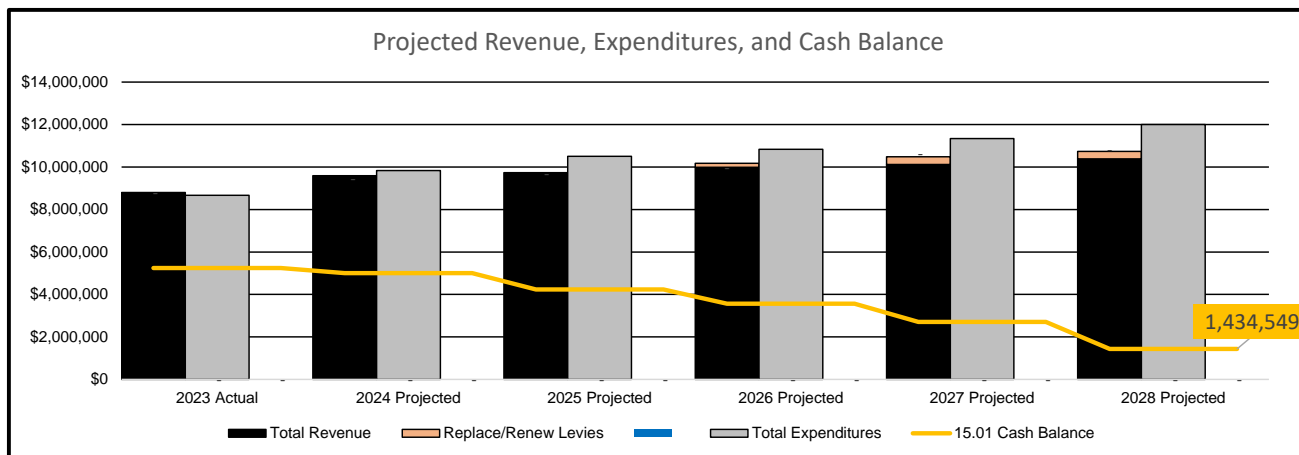
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### Forecast Purpose/Objectives

Ohio Department of Education's purposes/objectives for the five-year forecast are:

1. To engage the local board of education and the community in the long range planning and discussions of financial issues facing the school district.
2. To serve as a basis for determining the school district's ability to sign the certificate required by O.R.C. §5705.412, commonly known as the "412 certificate."
3. To provide a method for the Department of Education and Auditor of State to identify school districts with potential financial problems.

**Forecast Methodology** - This forecast is prepared based upon historical trends and current factors. This information is then extrapolated into estimates for subsequent years. The forecast variables can change multiple times throughout the fiscal year and while cash flow monitoring helps to identify unexpected variances no process is guaranteed. The intent is to provide the district's financial trend over time and a roadmap for decisions aimed at encouraging financial sustainability and stability.

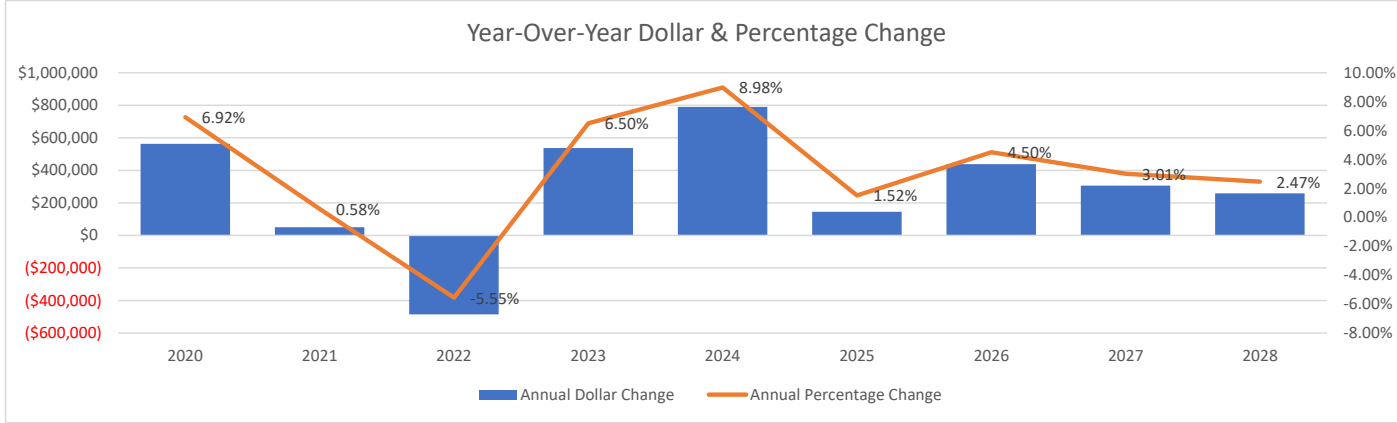
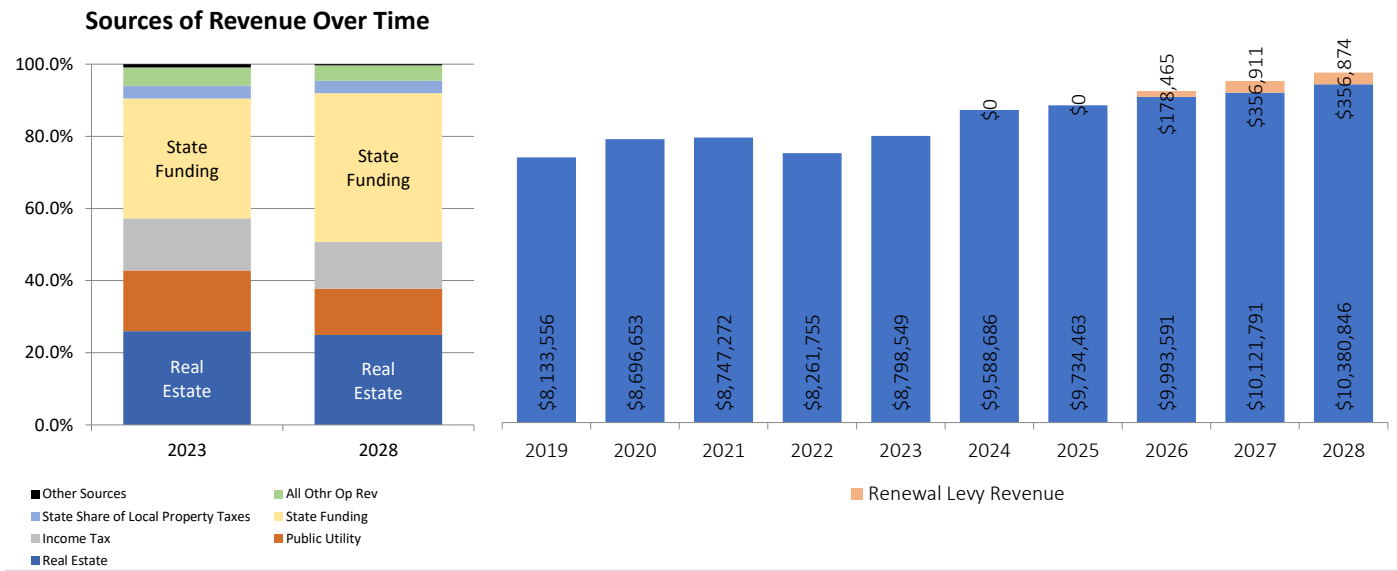

In FY 2024 a revenue shortfall is expected. This means that expenditures are expected to be greater than revenue by \$240,579 in FY 2024. By the last year of the forecast, FY 2028, the district is expected to have a revenue shortfall where expenditures are projected to be greater than revenue by \$1,623,832. The district would need to cut its FY 2028 projected expenses by 13.53% in order to balance its budget without additional revenue.

The district's cash balance is positive at year-end in FY 2024 and is projected to worsen by FY 2028. A worsening cash balance can erode the district's financial stability over time.

Ohio adopted the Fair School Funding Plan (FSFP) in FY 2022. The plan was continued with increasing phase-in of the formula results. In FY 2024 the per pupil base cost calculations were updated from FY 2018 cost data to FY 2022. For Arcadia Local School District the calculated Base Cost total is \$5,588,369 in FY 2024. The state's share of the calculated Base Cost total is \$2,195,427 or \$3,775 per pupil.

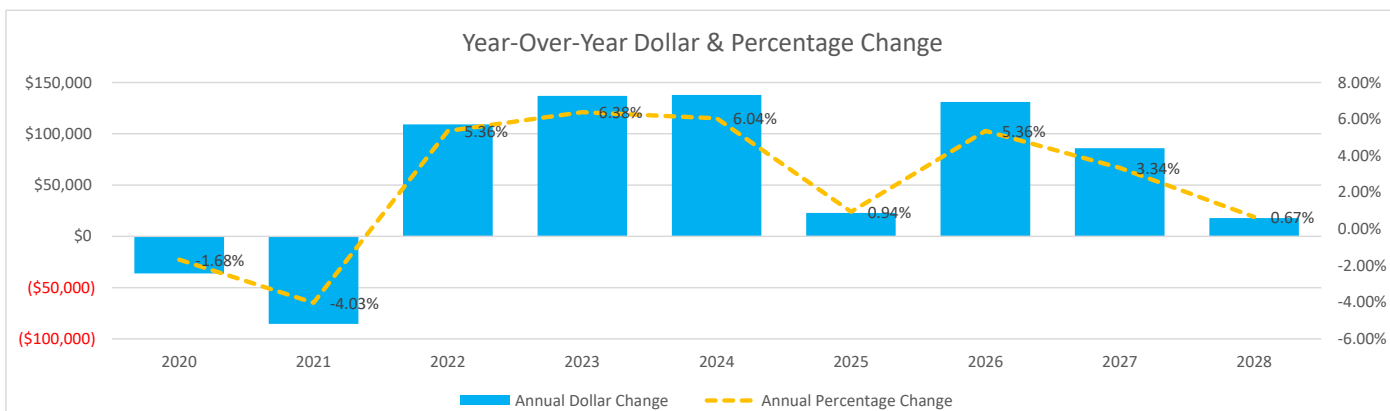
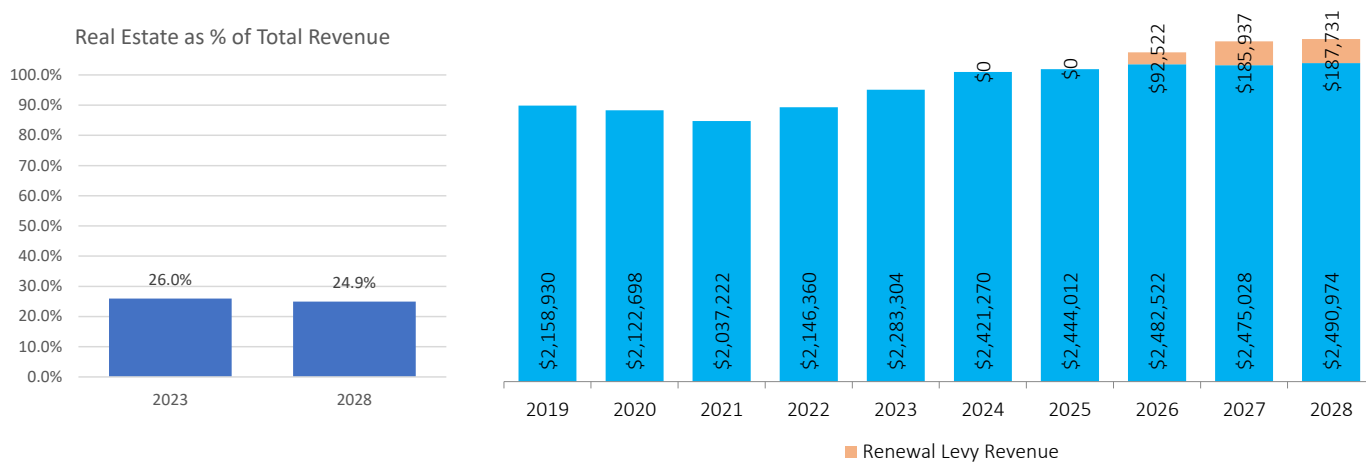

### 1.010 - General Property Tax (Real Estate)

Revenue collected from taxes levied by a school district by the assessed valuation of real property using effective tax rates for class I (residential/agricultural) and class II (business).



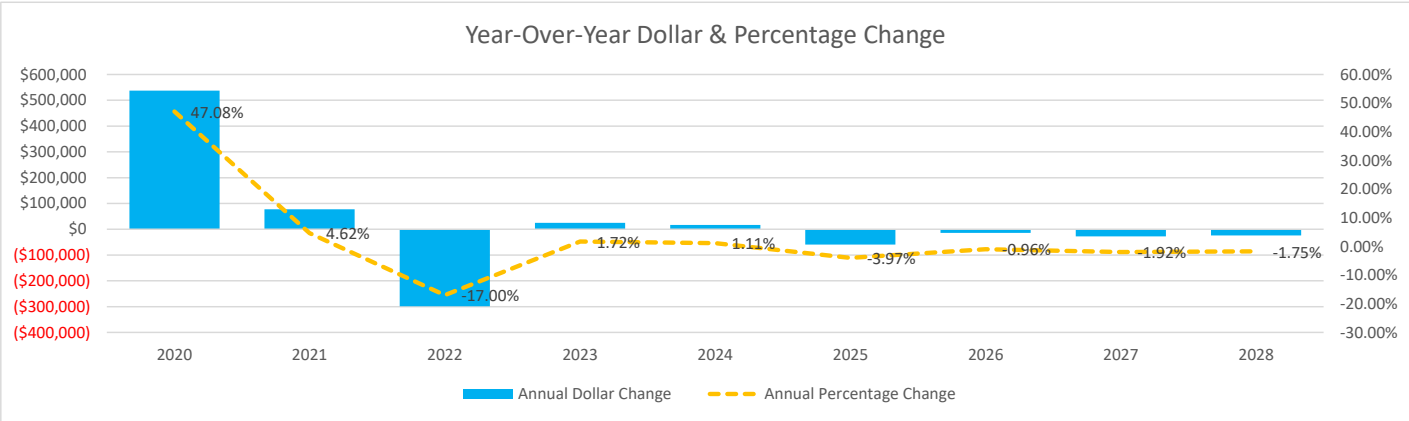
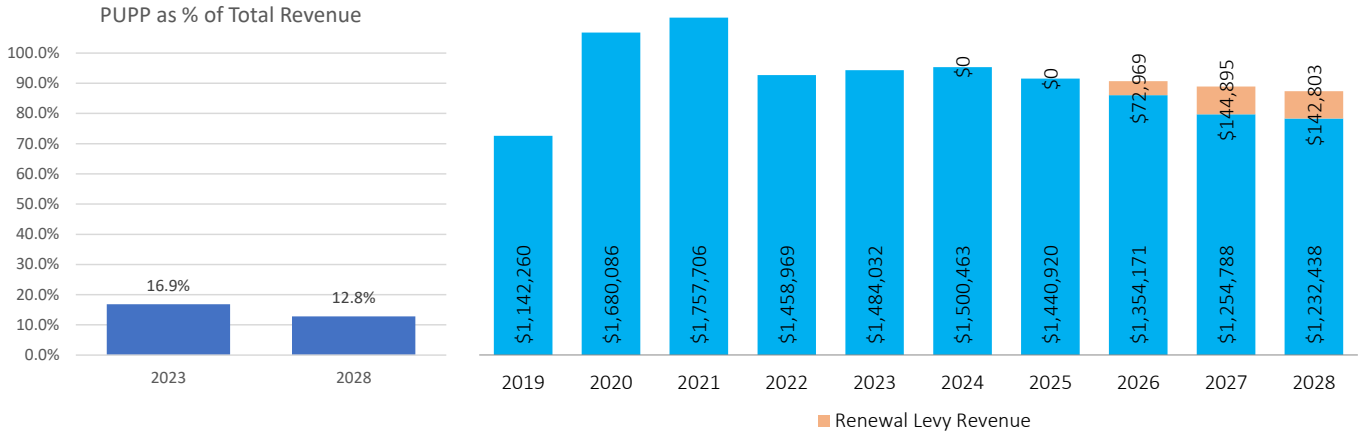

Real estate property tax revenue accounts for 25.95% of total revenue. Class I or residential/agricultural taxes make up approximately 90.66% of the real estate property tax revenue. The Class I tax rate is 24.4 mills in tax year 2023. The district is modeling the renewal of real estate property taxes levies through 2024. The projections reflect an average gross collection rate of 100.0% annually through tax year 2027. The revenue changed at an average annual historical rate of 1.51% and is projected to change at an average annual rate of 3.27% through FY 2028.

### 1.020 - Public Utility Personal Property

Revenue generated from public utility personal property valuations multiplied by the district's full voted tax rate.



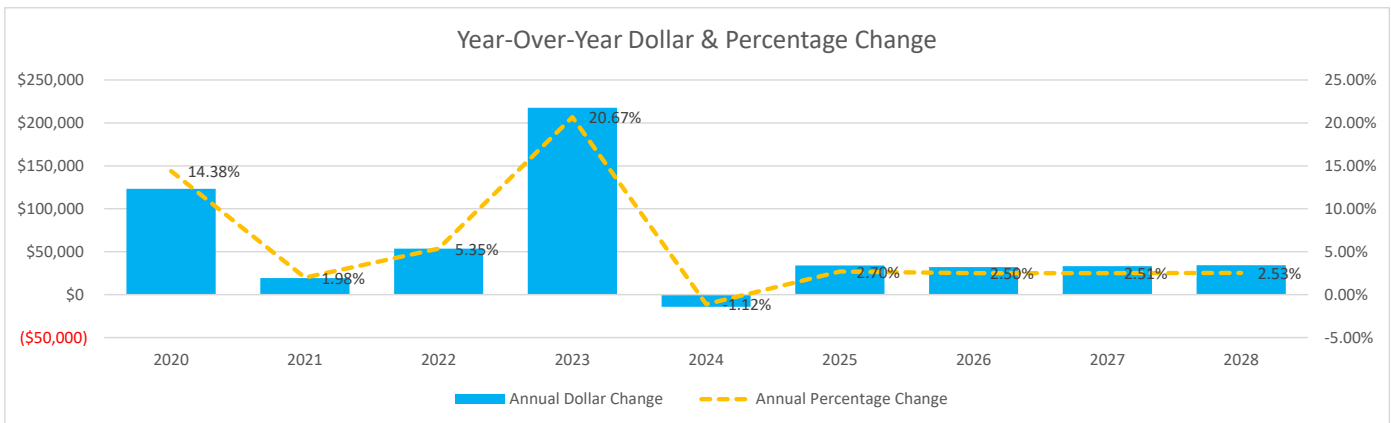
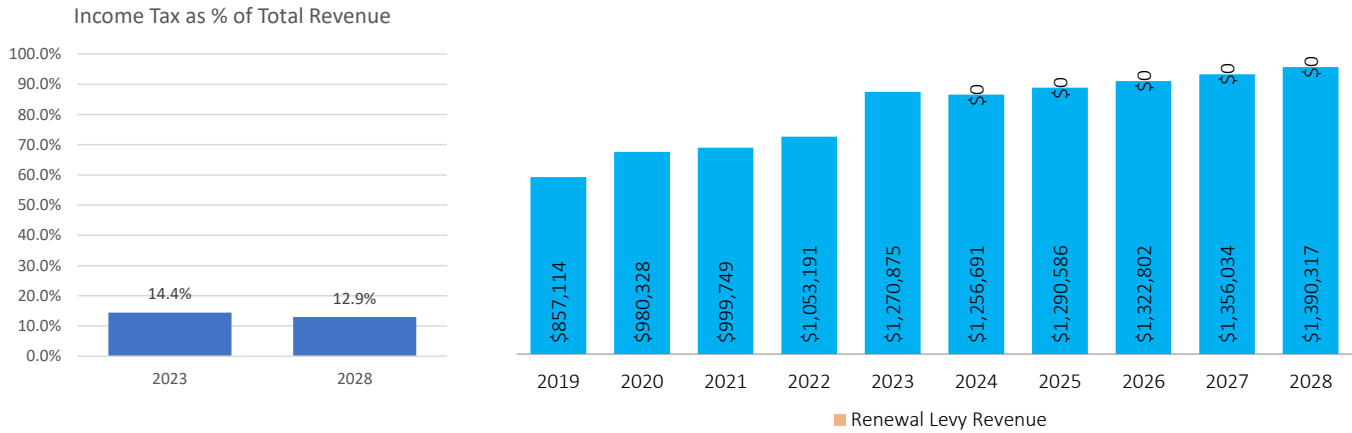

The public utility personal property tax revenue is generated from the personal property values, additions, and depreciation reported by the utility companies. This category currently makes up 16.87% of total district revenue. The property is taxed at the full voted tax rate which in tax year 2023 is 27.3 mills. The forecast is modeling an average gross collection rate of 61.93%. The revenue changed historically at an average annual dollar amount of \$85,443 and is projected to change at an average annual dollar amount of -\$21,758 through FY 2028.

### 1.030 - Income Tax

Revenue collected from income tax earmarked specifically to support schools with a voter approved tax by residents of the school district; separate from federal, state and municipal income taxes.

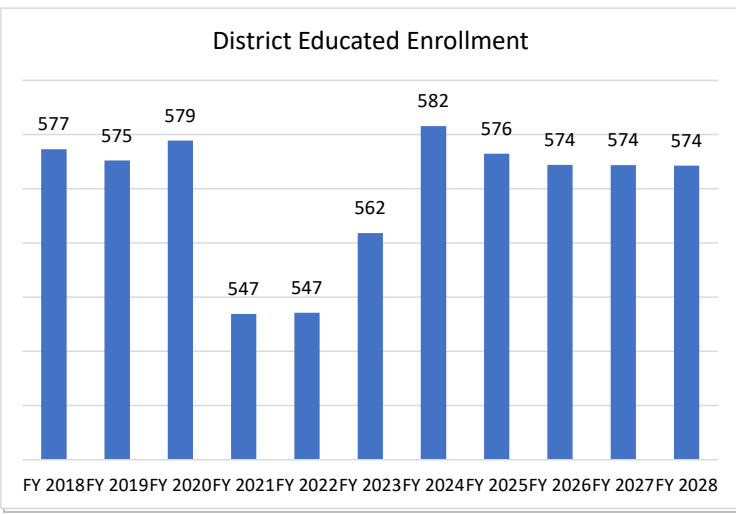
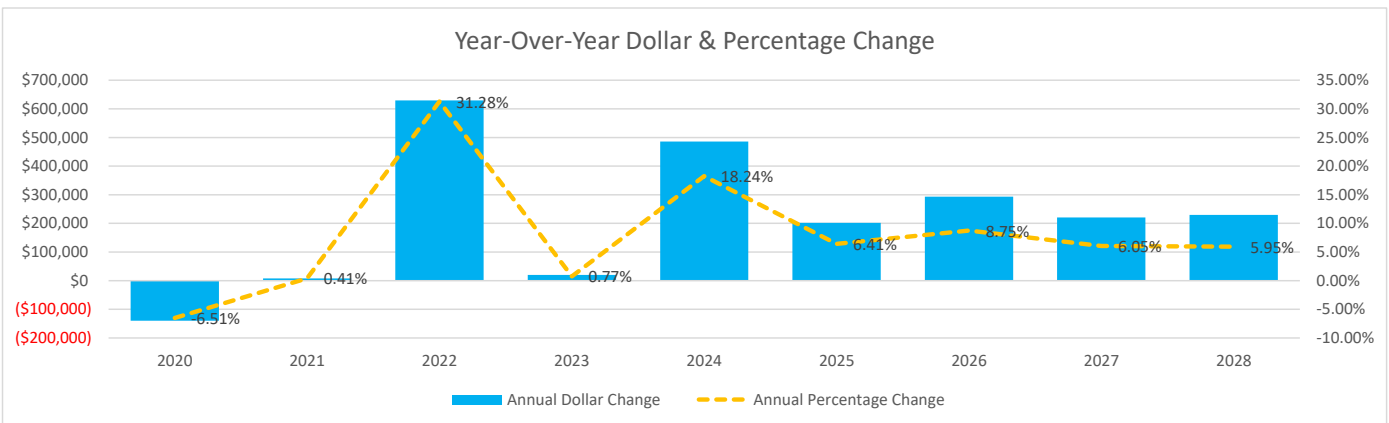
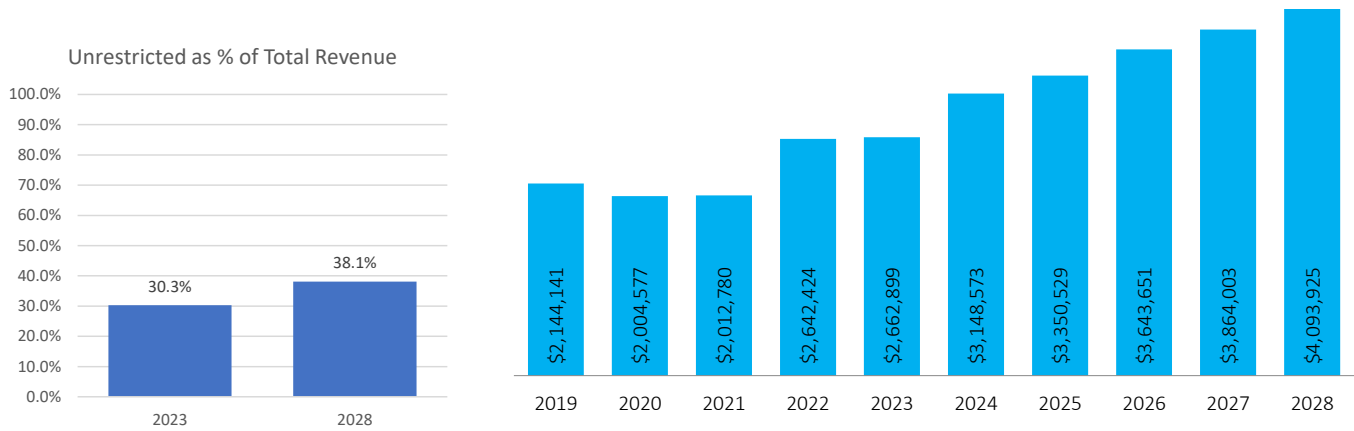


The district maintained one income tax levy in FY 2023. The average annual dollar change in total income tax revenue is forecasted to be \$23,888 through FY 2028. Income tax revenue is projected to account for 12.9% of total district revenue in FY 2028.

### 1.035 - Unrestricted Grants-in-Aid

Funds received through the State Foundation Program with no restriction.



Beginning in FY 2022 Ohio adopted the Fair School Funding Plan (FSFP). Funding is driven by a base cost methodology that incorporates the four components identified as necessary to the education process. The Base Cost is currently calculated for two years using a statewide average from historical actual data.

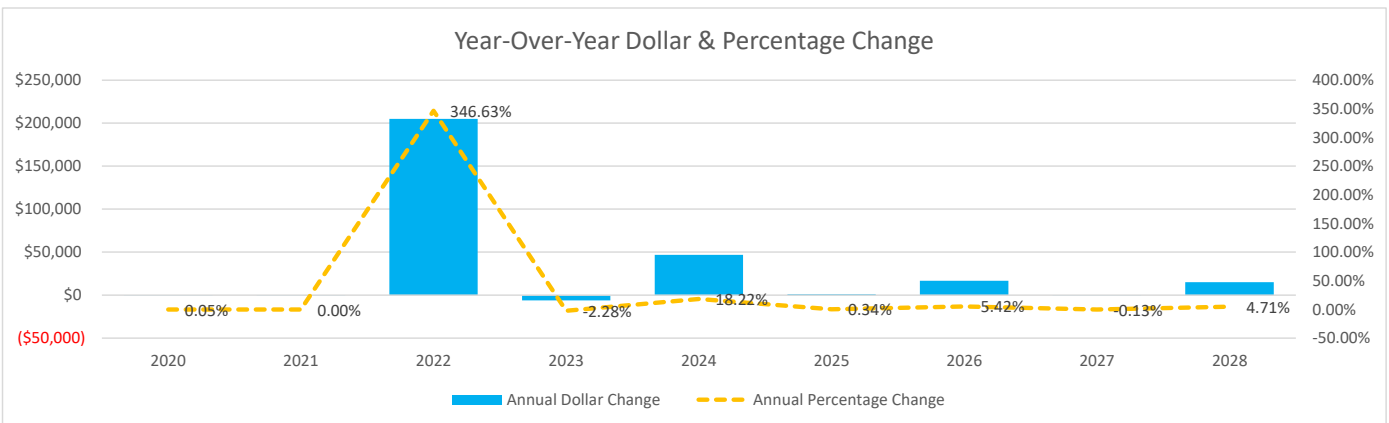
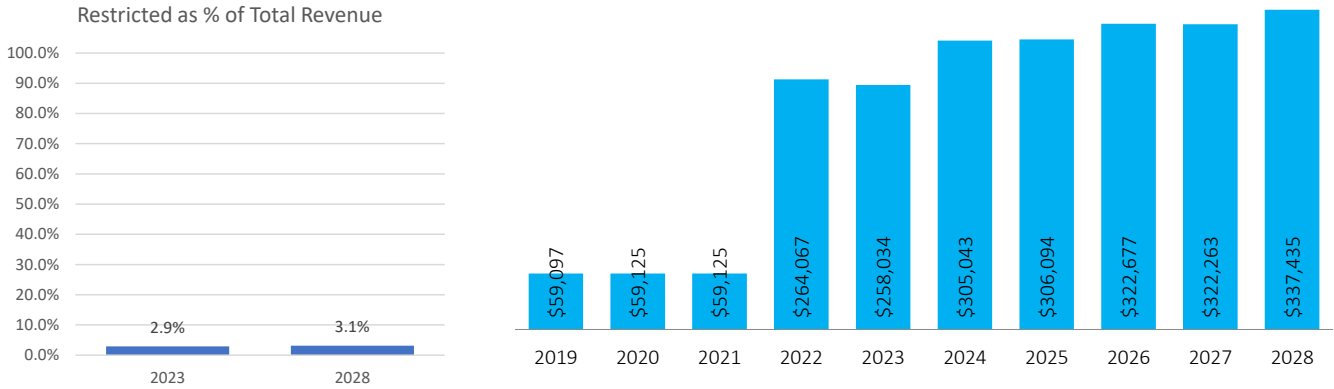
For Arcadia Local School District the calculated Base Cost total is \$5,588,369 in FY 2024. The state's share of the calculated Base Cost total is \$2,195,427 or \$3,775 per pupil.

The FSFP also started funding students where they attended school. Therefore district educated enrollment is now used for per pupil funding. At the same time, the FSFP eliminated tuition transfer payments from school districts.



### 1.040 & 1.045 - Restricted Grants-in-Aid

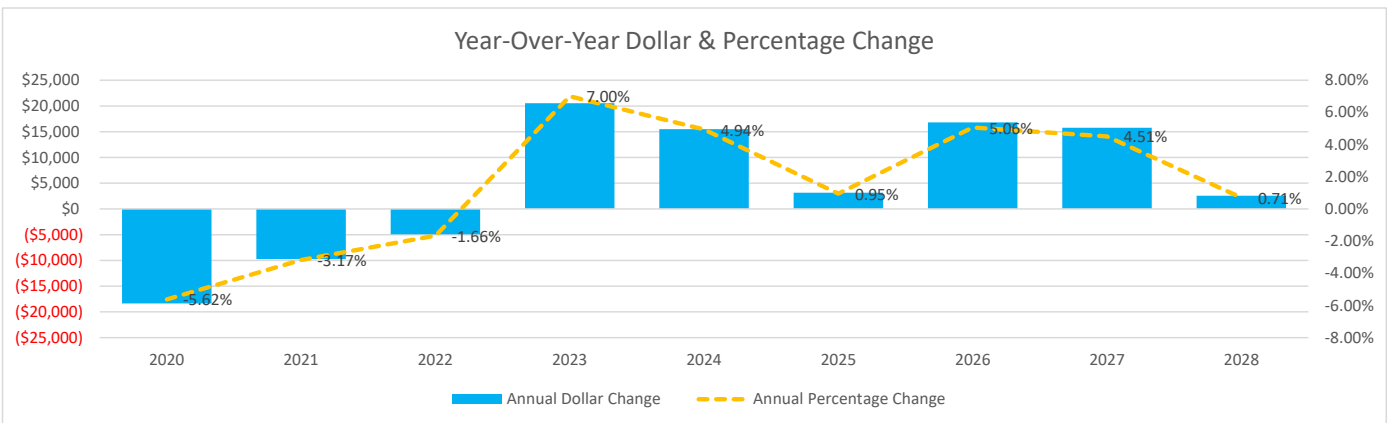
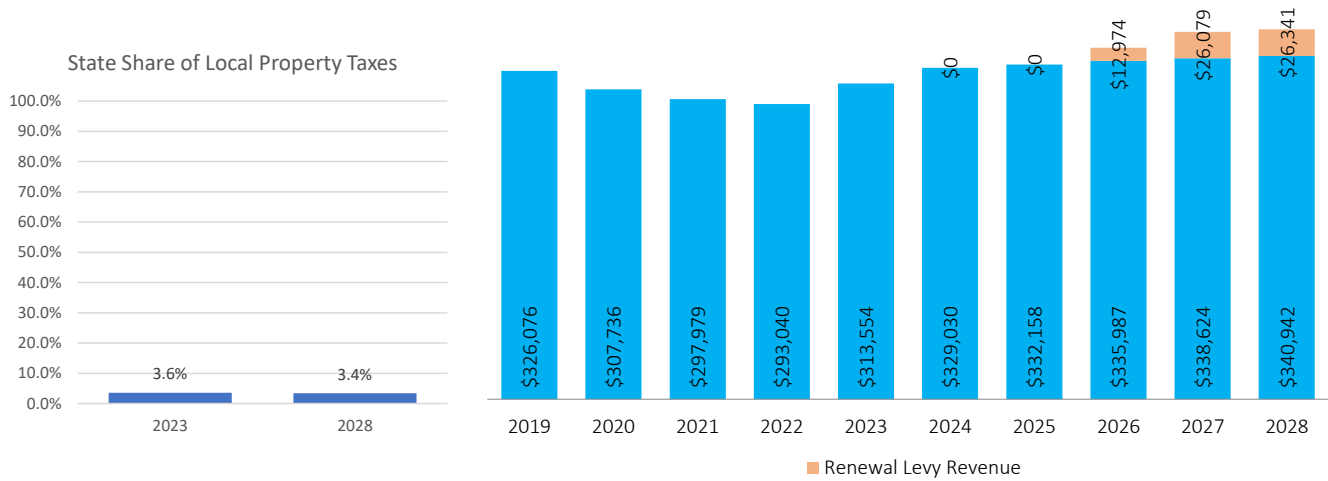
Funds received through the State Foundation Program or other allocations that are restricted for specific purposes.



Restricted aid is the portion of state per pupil funding that must be classified as restricted use. Historically the district's restricted state aid changed annually on average by \$66,303 and is projected to change annually on average by \$15,880. Restricted funds represent 2.93% of total revenue. Starting in FY 2022 the district's Success & Wellness funding is considered restricted, the state's share of this funding is recorded as restricted is \$166,643. This funding has implications on general fund expenditures in that certain spending now occurring in a fund external to the general fund could shift to the general fund. The expenditures in this forecast are adjusted to reflect this change.

### 1.050 - State Share of Local Property Taxes

Includes funds received for Tangible Personal Property Tax Reimbursement, Electric Deregulation, Homestead and Rollback.

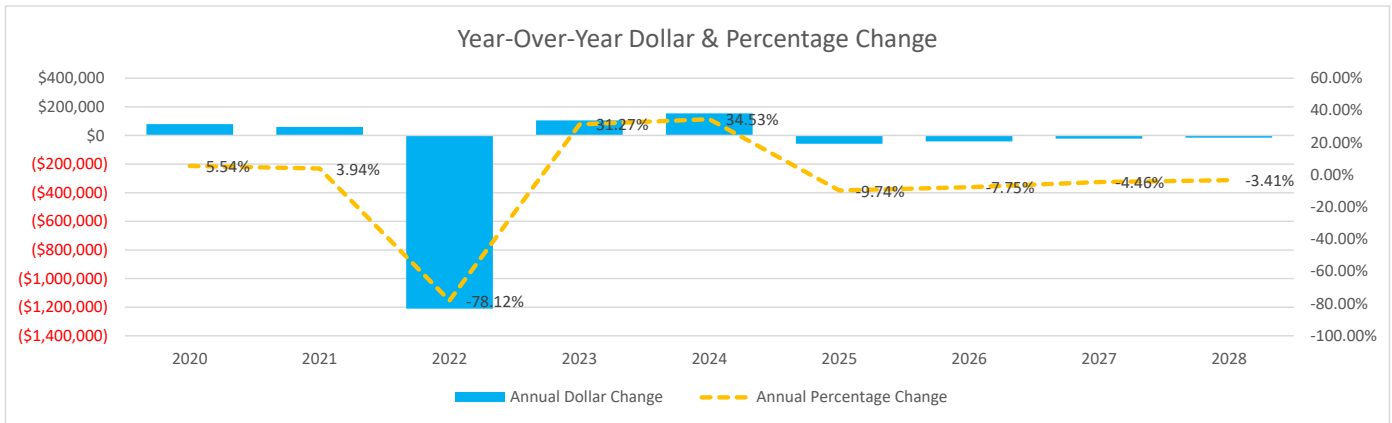
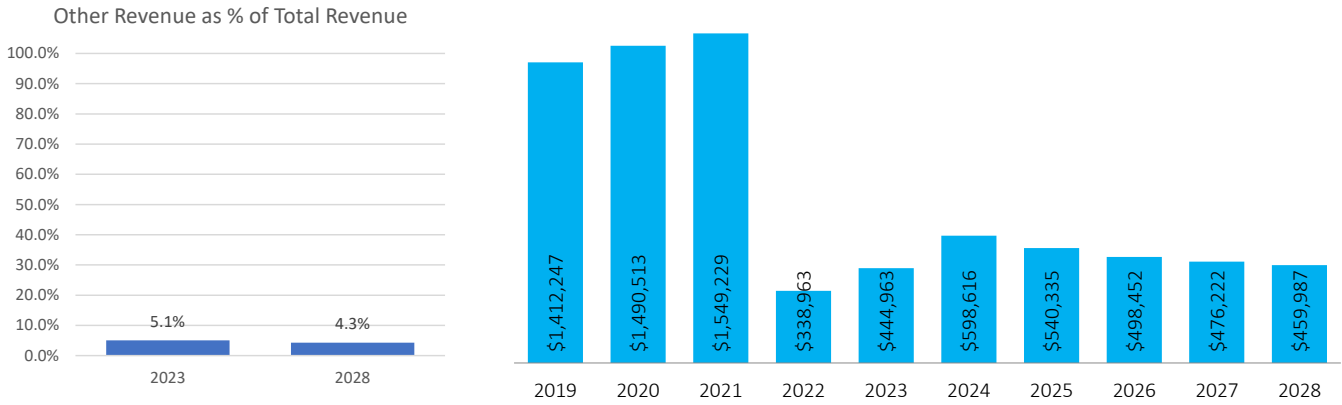


State Share of Local Property Taxes primarily consists of reimbursements from the state of Ohio for local taxpayer credits or reductions. The state reduces the local taxpayer's tax bill with a 10% rollback credit, and 2.5% owner-occupied rollback credit, plus a homestead credit for qualifying taxpayers. In FY 2024, approximately 11.5% local residential property taxes will be reimbursed by the state in the form of rollback credits and approximately 1.5% will be reimbursed in the form of qualifying homestead exemption credits.

### 1.060 - All Other Operating Revenues

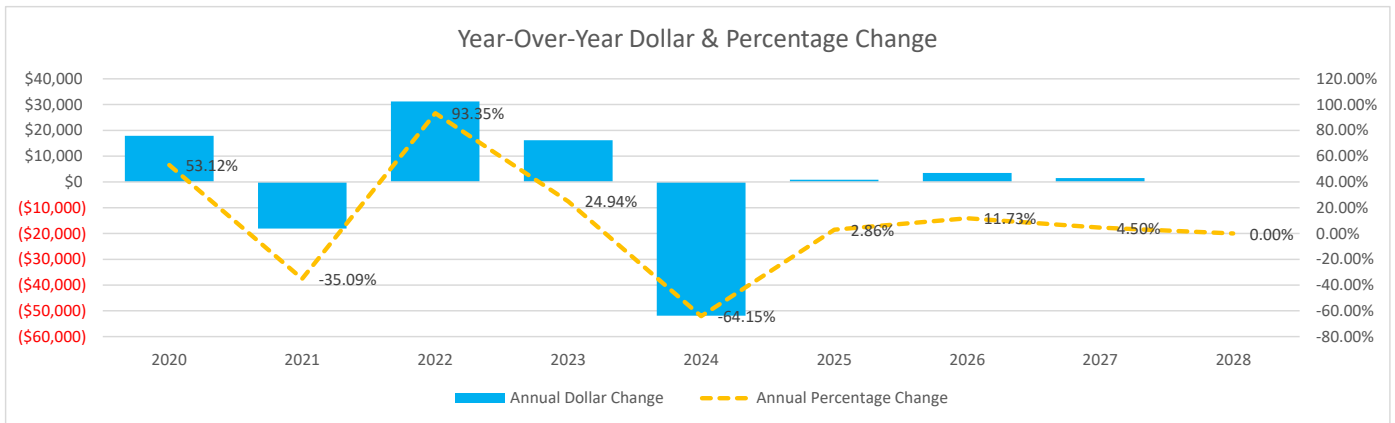
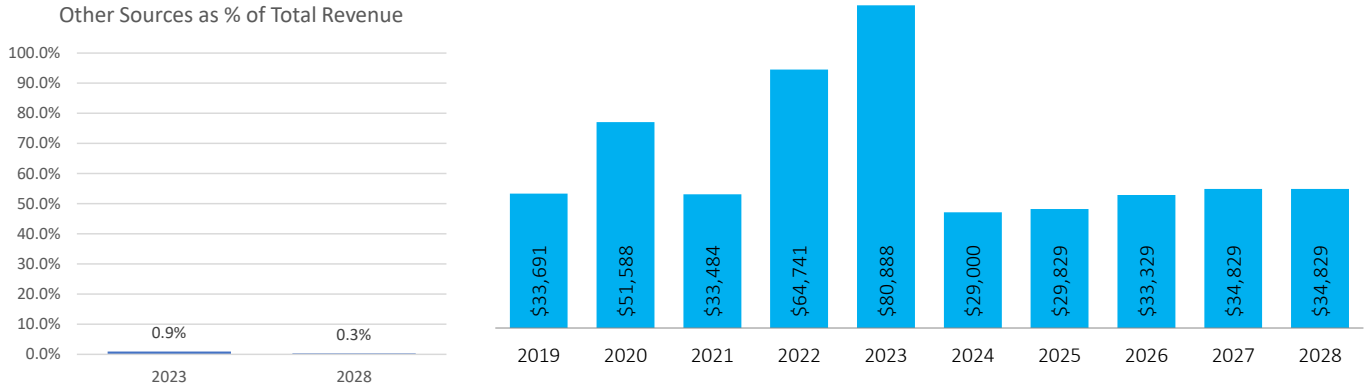
Operating revenue sources not included in other lines; examples include tuition, fees, earnings on investments, rentals, and donations.



Other revenue includes tuition received by the district for non-resident students educated by the district. It also includes interest income, payments in lieu of taxes, and miscellaneous revenue. The historical average annual change was -\$241,821. The projected average annual change is \$3,005 through FY 2028.

## 2.070 - Total Other Financing Sources

Includes proceeds from sale of notes, state emergency loans and advancements, operating transfers-in, and all other financing sources like sale and loss of assets, and refund of prior year expenditures.

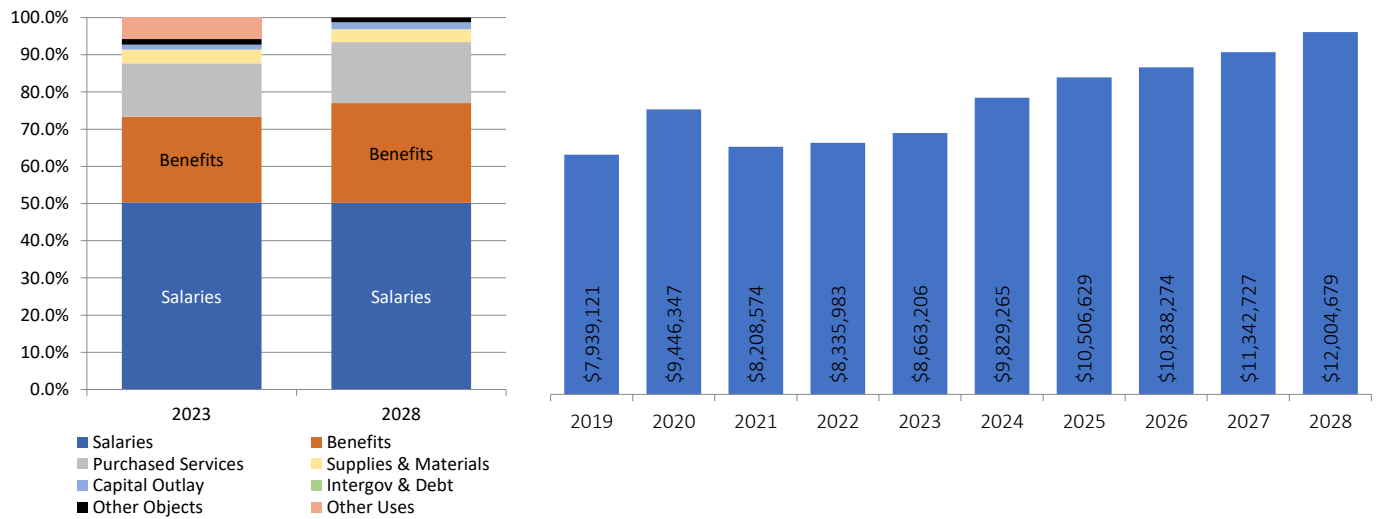

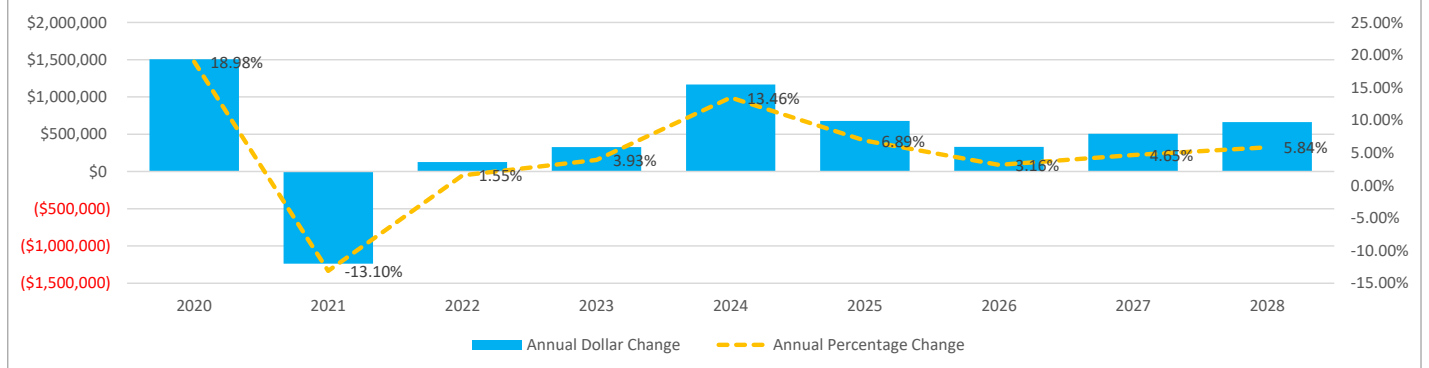
Other sources includes revenue that is generally classified as non-operating. Return advances-in are the most common revenue source. In FY 2023 the district receipted \$22,719 as advances-in and is projecting advances of \$0 in FY 2024. The district also receives other financing sources such as refund of prior year expenditures in this category. The district is projecting that all other financing sources will be \$29,000 in FY 2024 and average \$33,204 annually through FY 2028.

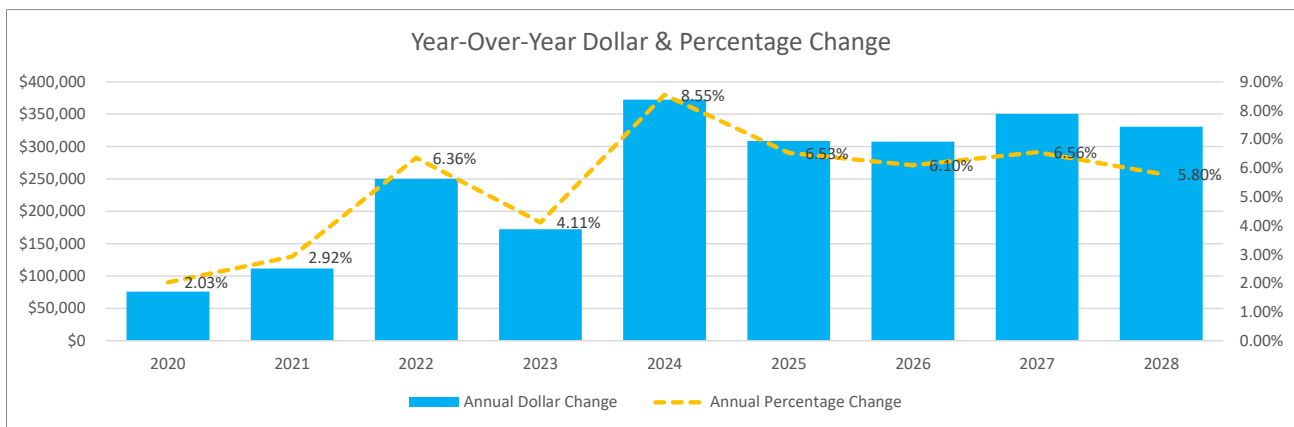
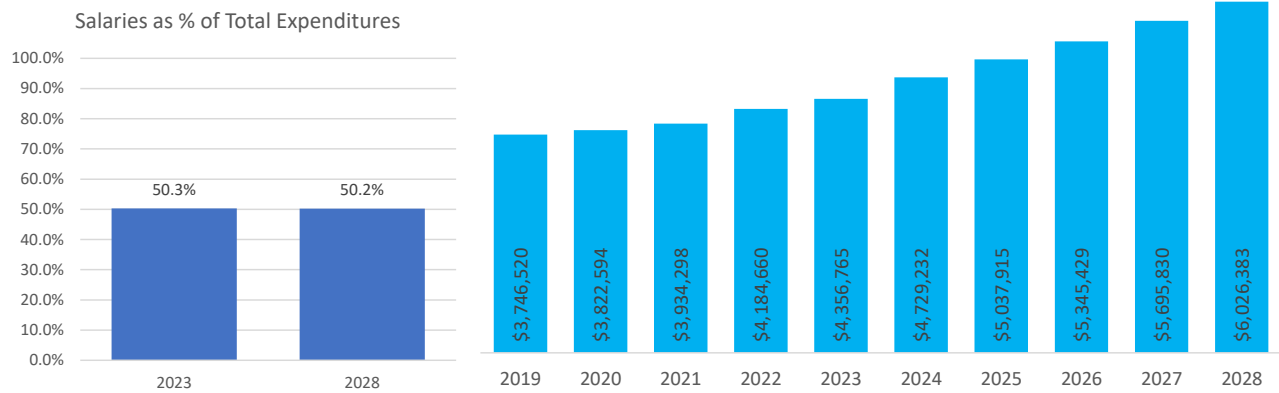

### 3.010 - Personnel Services

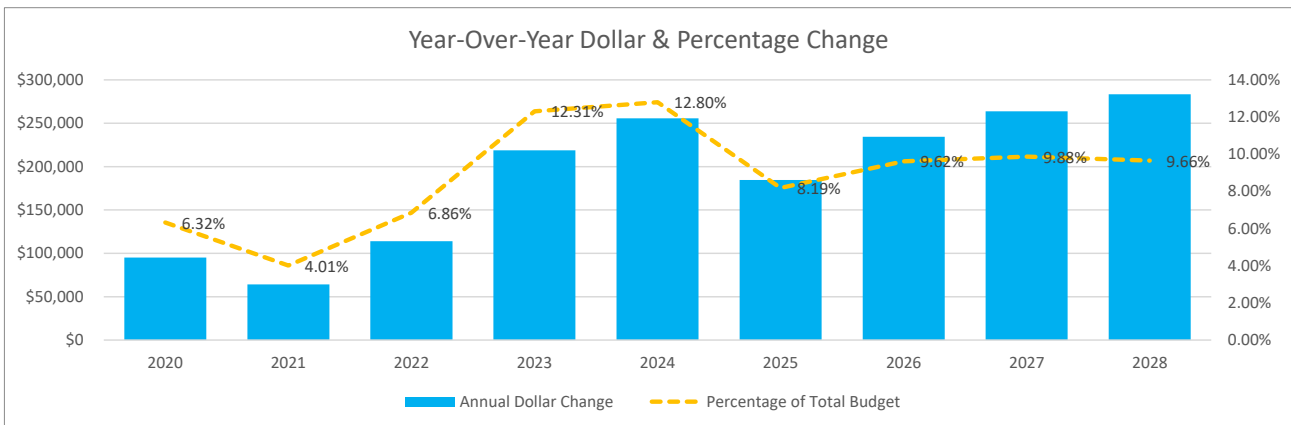
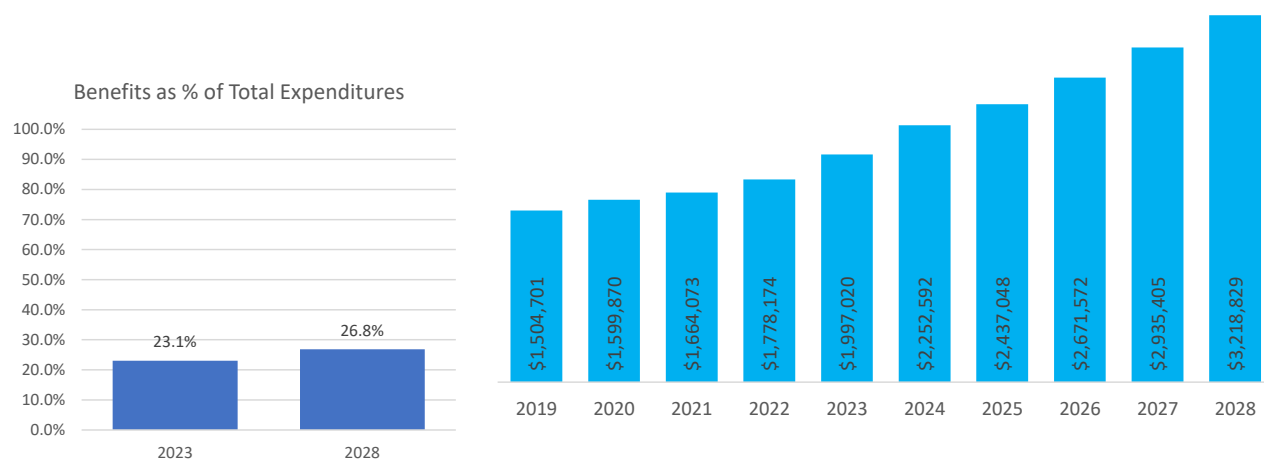
Employee salaries and wages, including extended time, severance pay, supplemental contracts, etc.



Salaries represent 50.29% of total expenditures and increased at a historical average annual rate of 3.86% or \$152,561. This category of expenditure is projected to grow at an annual average rate of 6.71% or \$333,923 through FY 2028. The projected average annual rate of change is 2.85% more than the five year historical annual average.

### 3.020 - Employees' Benefits

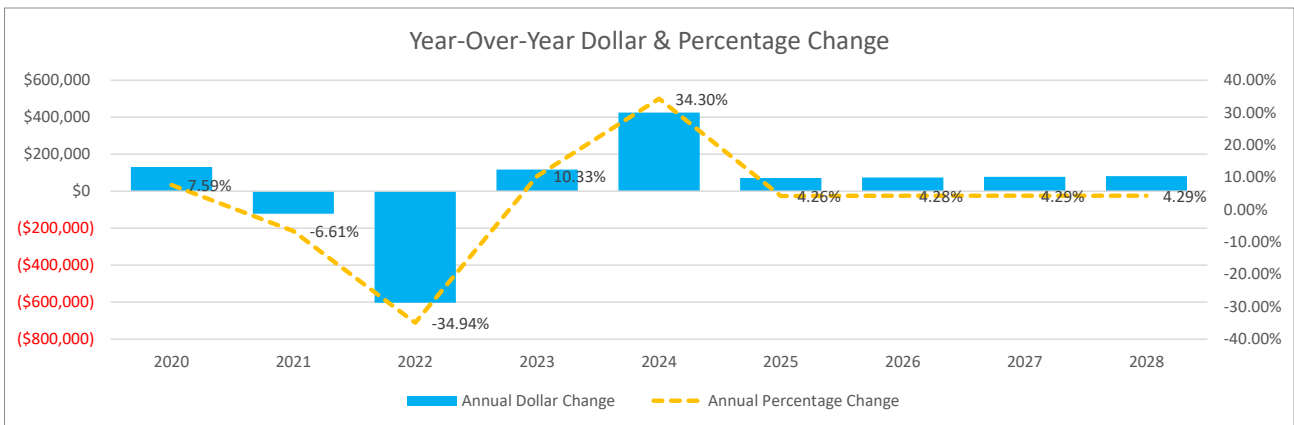
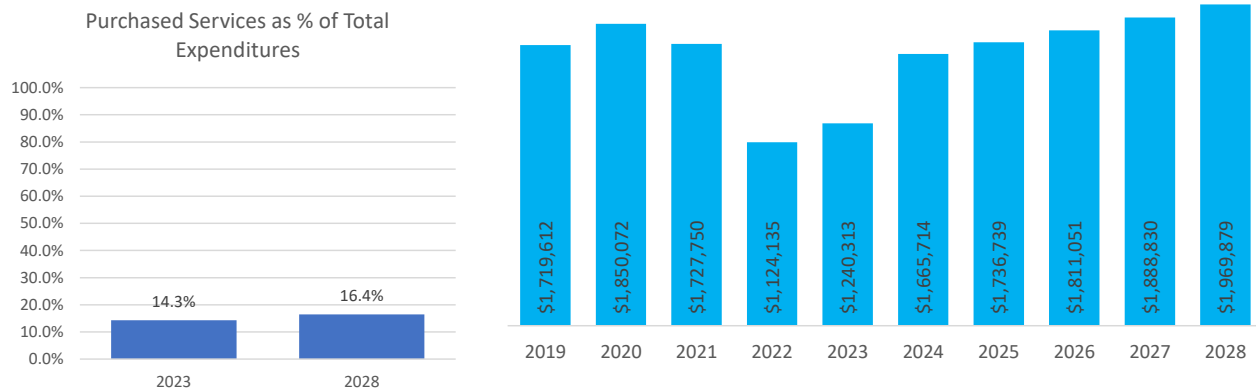
Retirement for all employees, Workers Compensation, early retirement incentives, Medicare, unemployment, pickup on pickup, and all health-related insurances.



Benefits represent 23.05% of total expenditures and increased at a historical average annual rate of 7.38%. This category of expenditure is projected to grow at an annual average rate of 10.03% through FY 2028. The projected average annual rate of change is 2.65% more than the five year historical annual average.

### 3.030 - Purchased Services

Amounts paid for personal services rendered by personnel who are not on the payroll of the school district, expenses for tuition paid to other districts, utilities costs and other services which the school district may purchase.

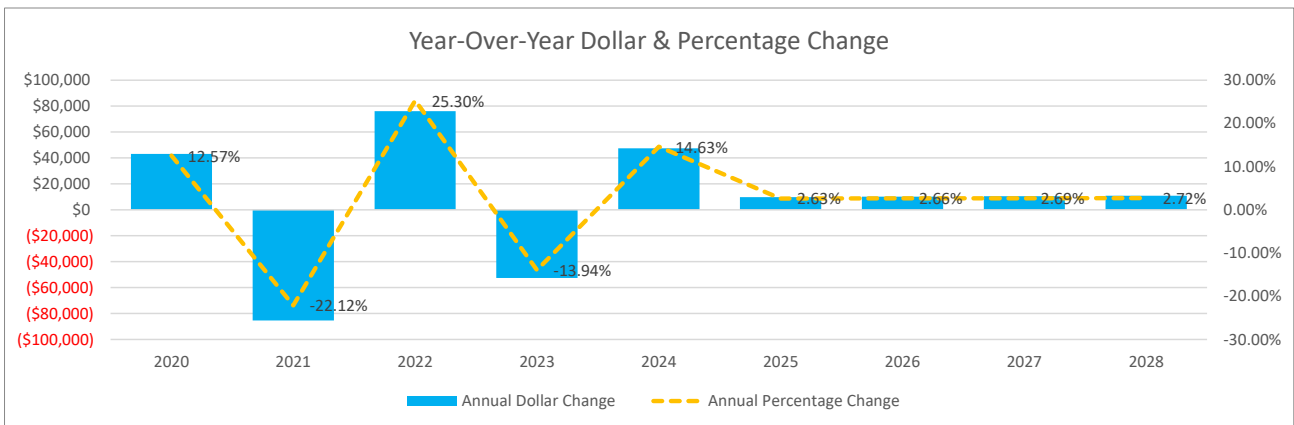
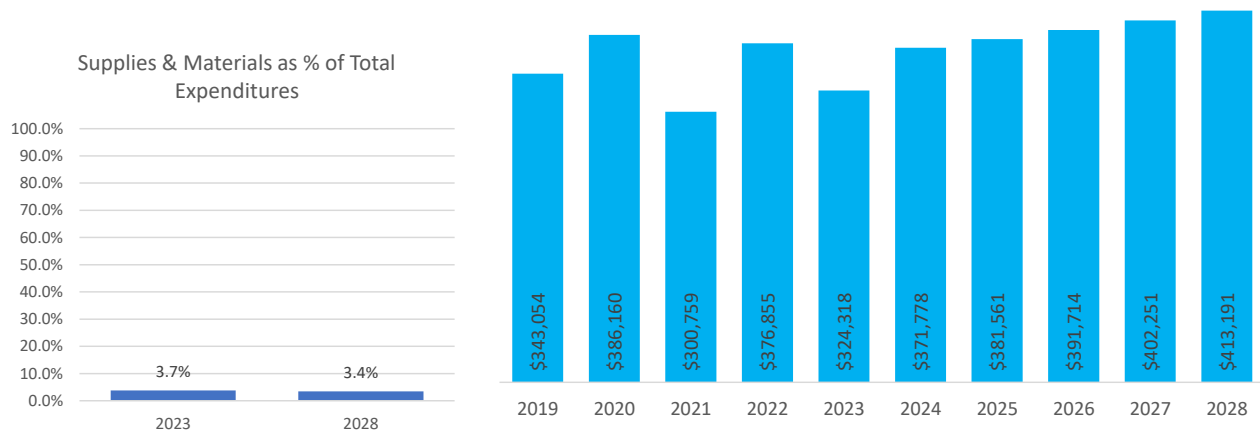


Purchased Services represent 14.32% of total expenditures and decreased at a historical average annual rate of -5.91%. This category of expenditure is projected to grow at an annual average rate of 10.29% through FY 2028. The FSP funds only district educated enrollment thereby reducing tuition cost for open enrollment out, community schools, STEM, and scholarships starting in FY 2022. This change resulted in lower district cost but also less per pupil state revenue since per pupil funding was paid directly by the state to the attending school.



### 3.040 - Supplies & Materials

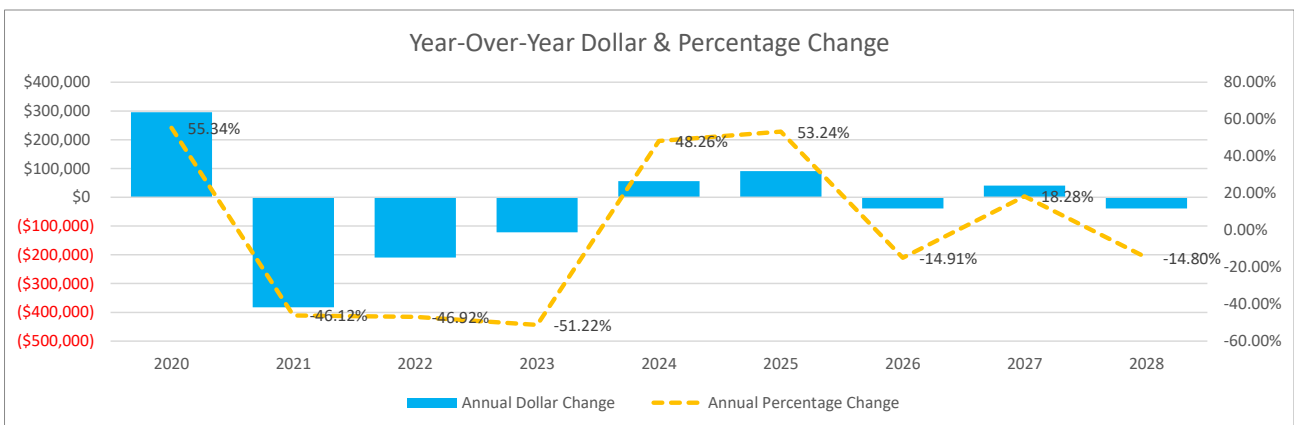
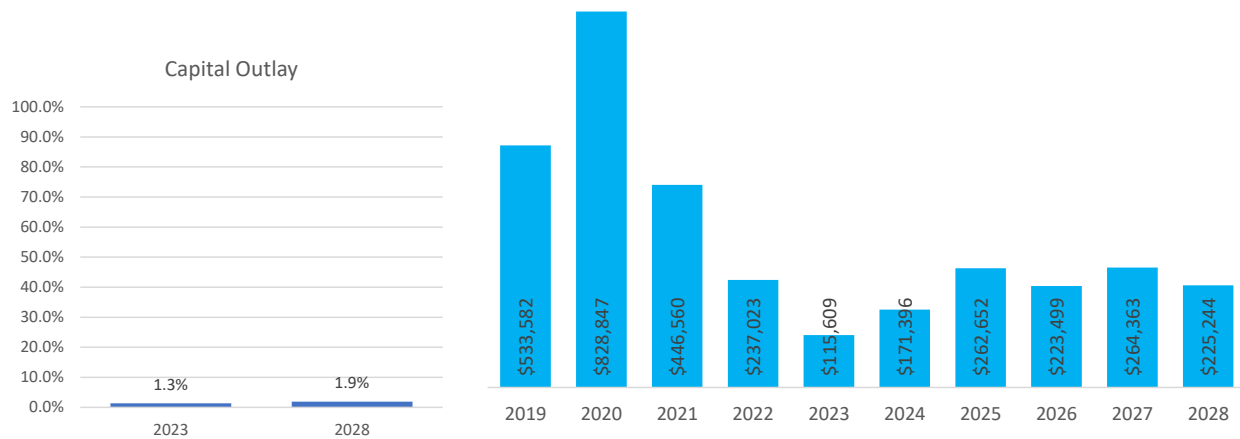
Expenditures for general supplies, instructional materials including textbooks and media material, bus fuel and tires, and all other maintenance supplies.



Supplies & Materials represent 3.74% of total expenditures and increased at a historical average annual rate of 0.45%. This category of expenditure is projected to grow at an annual average rate of 5.07% through FY 2028. The projected average annual rate of change is 4.61% more than the five year historical annual average.

### 3.050 - Capital Outlay

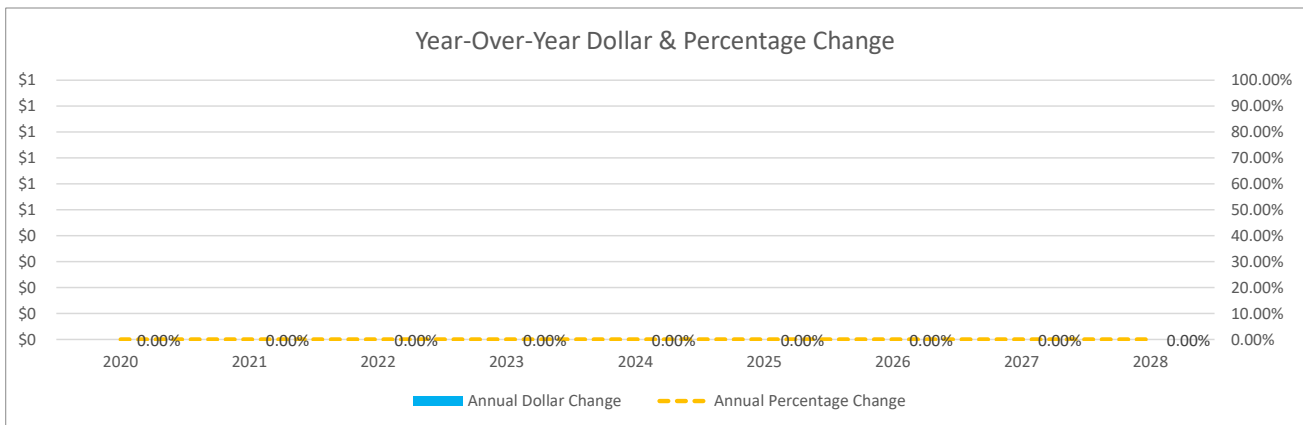
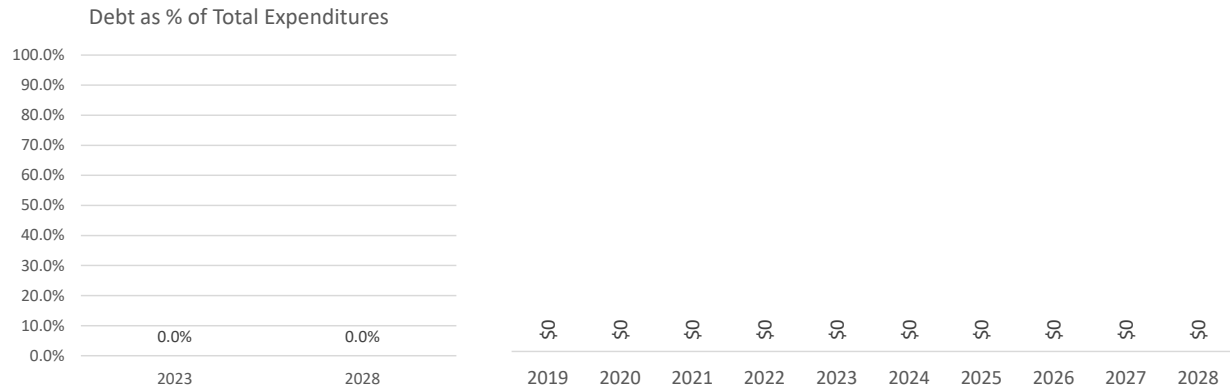
This line includes expenditures for items having at least a five-year life expectancy, such as land, buildings, improvements of grounds, equipment, computers/technology, furnishings, and buses.



Capital Outlay represent 1.33% of total expenditures and decreased at a historical average annual amount of -\$104,493. This category of expenditure is projected to grow at an annual average rate of \$21,927 through FY 2028. The projected average annual change is more than the five year historical annual average.

### 3.060-4.060 - Intergovernmental & Debt

These lines account for pass through payments, as well as monies received by a district on behalf of another governmental entity, plus principal and interest payments for general fund borrowing.

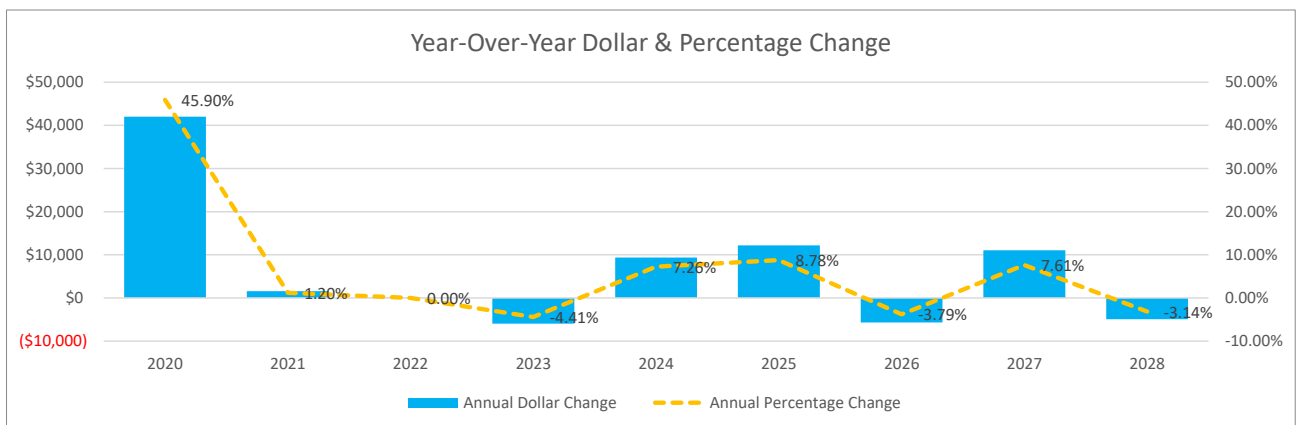
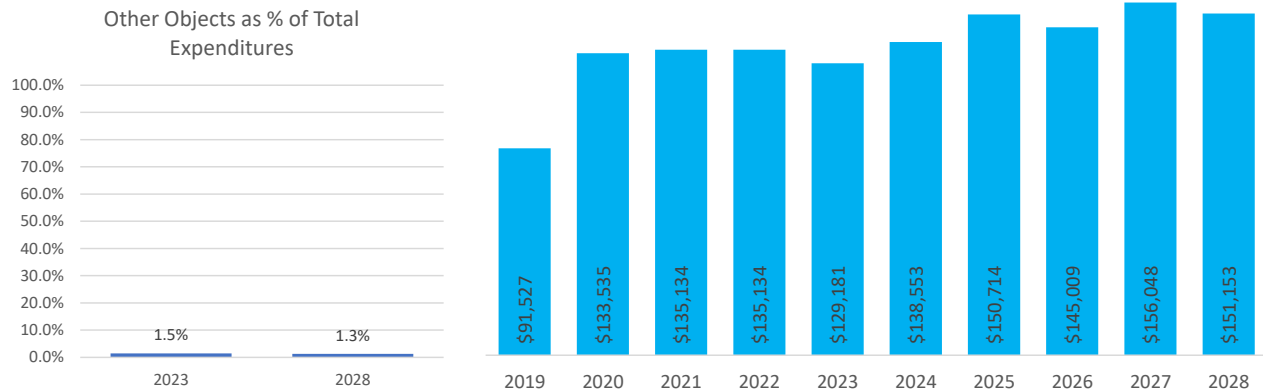


The Intergovernmental/Debt expenditure category details general fund debt issued by the District.

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### 4.300 - Other Objects

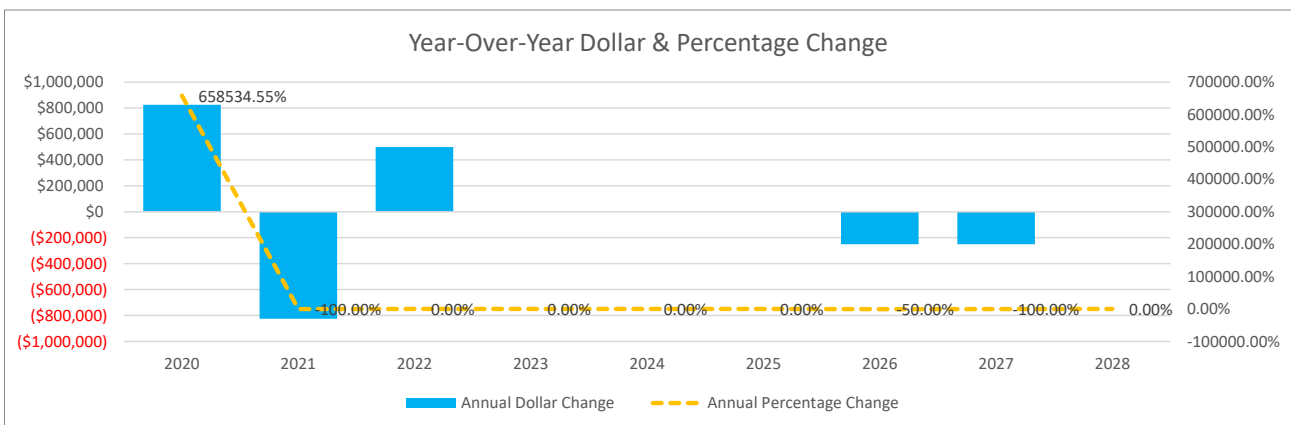
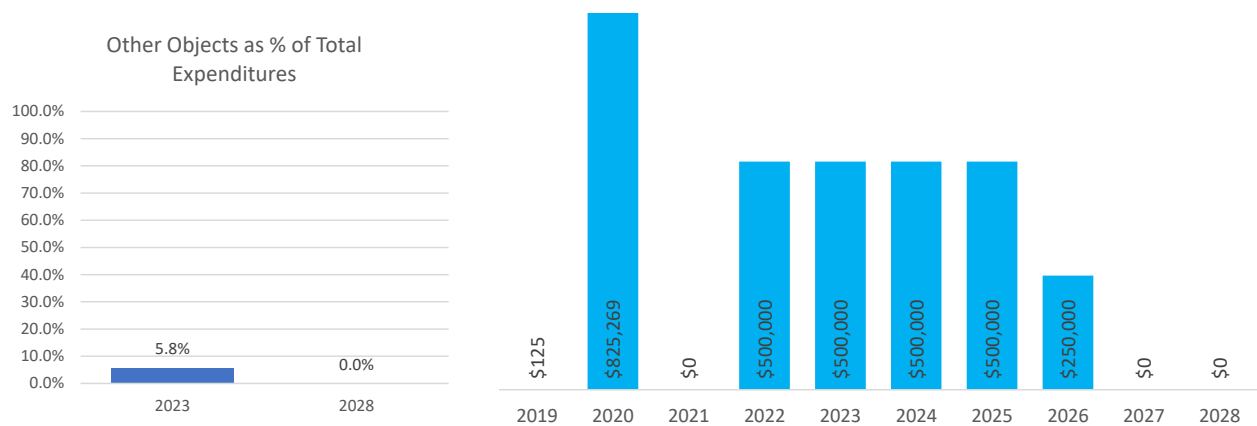
Primary components for this expenditure line are membership dues and fees, ESC contract deductions, County Auditor/Treasurer fees, audit expenses, and election expenses.



Other Objects represent 1.49% of total expenditures and increased at a historical average annual rate of 10.67%. This category of expenditure is projected to grow at an annual average rate of 3.34% through FY 2028. The projected average annual rate of change is -7.33% less than the five year historical annual average.

### 5.040 - Total Other Financing Uses

Operating transfers-out, advances out to other funds, and all other general fund financing uses.

Other uses includes expenditures that are generally classified as non-operating. It is typically in the form of advances-out which are then repaid into the general fund from the other district funds. In FY 2023 the district had no advances-out and has no advances-out forecasted through FY 2028. The district can also move general funds permanently to other funds and as the schedule above presents, the district has transfers forecasted through FY 2028. The table above presents the district's planned advances and transfers. The district can also have other uses of funds which is reflected in the table above.
