Superintendent's Report from Dave Golden

Greetings;

I would first like to comment about how pleased I am to serve as your Superintendent here at Arcadia. I am looking forward to helping move this great school in an even more positive direction. The Board of Education is developing a Strategic Plan, which will be a blueprint in guiding us over many years. A strategic plan begins with collecting data through surveying stakeholders. Once these surveys are completed, subgroups will interpret the data and make recommendations as to what our greatest needs are in the district. From there, a committee will take the recommendations and make a multi-faceted plan of action. This plan will include a timeline for engaging/implementing the plan, goals, how we will measure the achievement of goals, and a time for reviewing the plan.

One of the focus areas of the plan will be regarding facilities. It is important to remember the ages of our buildings. The ages of our instructional spaces are as follows: 1923, 1953, 1961, 1976 and 2019. With the ages of the majority of these buildings, there is a significant need to repair/replace things as they continue their service to our district.

Over the past six years, the School Board has made a commitment to repairs/upgrades. Some of those repairs/upgrades include windows, entry doors, classroom doors, updates in security, plumbing lines, parking lot, a new entrance, lighting upgrades, classrooms, A/C in a few classrooms, a new boiler, WiFi upgrades, carpet/cupboards, electrical and weight room upgrades.

As you can see, there has been quite a bit of work done to maintain and improve the function of our facilities. While some of the things which have been done will not need addressed again for a long time, there is more needing attended to. Updates to heating systems, sewage lines, water lines, electrical systems, our front driveway, roofs on parts of our building, tuck pointing of our brick buildings along with others are and will be needing addressed.

Please Notify Us!

Please report any changes in address and/or phone numbers to the school as soon as possible. You can call the grade level office or make the change yourself in Final Forms. We need to maintain the most current information on each student. Please help us by notifying us of any changes that take place. This guarantees that all correspondence from the school reaches your home as quickly as possible. Many people are opting to use their cell phones as their main line. If you no longer have a 'land line', please let us know. **If you move within or out of Arcadia School district we need to know** this as soon as it happens. Your cooperation with this is greatly appreciated! We need to be able to contact you in the event of emergencies or notices that effect your children.

Arcadia Local Schools Families,

This is a new process for our school district. Your attention to the information below is required to make beginning of year information EASIER for all.

Arcadia Schools has partnered with FinalForms, an online forms and data management service. **FinalForms allows you to complete and sign all annual enrollment and athletic participation forms for your students online.** FinalForms saves data from year-to-year and season-to-season, meaning that you will never need to enter the same information twice! (Only if you have a change in address, phone, etc)

If we have your email on file, you should have received an email from FinalForms instructing you to set up your parent account. Then you will be able to view the information that we currently have on your student(s) and make changes as necessary. **You will not be receiving the packet of forms at the beginning of the year as you normally do. This takes the place of those!**

If you didn't receive an email from FinalForms, the district may need to update your email. You can go to the school website's main page and click on the link to complete the form or email your new email address to Mr. McKee @ mckeeg@arcadiaschools.org along with your students name(s).

FinalForms also pre-populates information wherever possible, for each of your students, saving you time. Once you have completed your registration online, you will simply be asked to review and update your information at the beginning of each school year to verify the information is current and sign the forms. You can also change information (address, phone, emergency medical, etc.) as it happens.

Your student(s), grades 7-12, will also be emailed (to their school email account) instructions to register for FinalForms and then can sign their sections of the forms as well.

Only ONE parent/guardian will need to register and use FinalForms. We will be communicating through your email for anything outstanding as well as special announcements. Please register at – <https://arcadia-oh.finalforms.com> now and electronically complete ALL forms!

For grades 7-12: If your student is in or will be in a sport this year, please indicate that on that student's account. All sports forms will then be available for you to complete. The actual sports physical paperwork should be handed in to the Athletic Director.

PreK-12 Notification System

Arcadia School will once again use the school-to-family communications service called **PreK-12 Notification**. We will use this service to deliver both emergency and non-emergency messages to you via telephone for 2021-2022 school year. Using PreK-12 Notification, we can quickly contact all families - in a matter of minutes - with urgent news such as school closings, early dismissals, delayed buses or rescheduled activities. We will also use the service to provide timely non-emergency information such as reminders about important meetings or special events at school that involve your children. In the case of school closings, this service is meant to be a compliment to the existing means of communications, TV stations, radio stations, etc. We will continue to utilize ALL of these mediums in the event of a school closure and/or delay.

Your primary phone number will be supplied to PreK - 12 Notification Service. Each family may add up to four telephone numbers. In an emergency the message will be delivered to all of your numbers.

Families that wish to include additional phone numbers may do so by calling the PreK-12 Notification Parent Hotline at 1-800-846-4976. For security reasons, you must call from your Primary phone number to manage your personal emergency contact list.

Search for Children with Disabilities

School districts across the state of Ohio are participating in an effort to identify, locate, and evaluate all children from birth through twenty-one years of age who may have disabilities. Disability, in this instance, means such conditions as hearing impairments, speech or language impairments, visual impairments, specific learning disabilities, multiple disabilities, mental retardation, emotionally disturbed, other health impairments, autism, traumatic brain injury, and physical impairments.

Public schools have responded vigorously to federal and state mandates requiring the provision of a free appropriate public education regardless of a child's disability. But before school districts can serve children, they must be found. Many children with disabilities are not visible because they do not function in the mainstream of the community, such as children who are homeless and children of migrant families. Also, many unidentified children with disabilities are preschoolers. Parents may not be aware their child has a disability or that there are programs and services available.

The school district will ask for information about the child, asking such questions as: What is the problem? What has already been done about the problem? What background information is available? This information may be collected in several ways including interviews, observations, screening, and testing. This information may be obtained from parents and the student, or from other agencies that have information about the student. This information will be used to decide whether the child has a disability and needs special services.

All information collected will be held in strict confidence and released to others only with parent permission or as allowed by law. For example, the school district will send records on request to a school district or other educational agency in which a student intends to enroll. The parents may have a copy of those records upon request.

The school district will keep a record of all persons who review confidential records with the exception of authorized school employees, or other educational agency personnel. The school will also maintain a list of those employees who may have access to records.

The school district or other educational agency will inform the parents when personally identifiable information collected, maintained, or used is no longer needed to provide educational services to the child. All personally identifiable data will be kept for at least five years or longer if required for audit purposes, or otherwise required by law.

Parents and students have rights in this process. Parents have the right to:

- ◆ Review their child's records;
- ◆ Refuse permission to release information (except as required by or permitted by, law to be released); and
- ◆ Request that information they believe to be inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of their child's privacy or other rights be changed. The district has a process to resolve disagreements about information collected.

The school district has appointed one person to make sure that information about students is kept confidential. Contact your school district board of education office for this person's name.

The school district's policies and procedures for special education are available. Contact the school district superintendent.

The school district operates an Educational Management Information System (EMIS) that assures a practical method of identifying which children are currently receiving special education services and which children are not. Certain data regarding children are maintained within this system.

School districts are interested in meeting the needs of children with disabilities. If you have or know of a child who may have a disability, contact your local school for more information and help.

IDEA-B FUNDS

The Arcadia Local Schools will once again be receiving Title VI-B Funds for the 2021-2022

This allocation is earmarked to help pay for the special education services Arcadia students receive through the Hancock County Educational Service Center. The school system would like to continue to use its IDEA-B money for this purpose.

HOMELESS STUDENTS

Children who meet the Federal definition of "homeless" will be provided a free and appropriate public education in the same manner as all other students of the District. To that end, homeless students will not be stigmatized or segregated on the basis of their status as homeless and will be assigned to the school serving those non-homeless students residing in the area in which the homeless child is actually living. No homeless student will be denied enrollment based on a lack of proof of residency. No Board policy, administrative guideline, or practice will be interpreted or applied in such a way as to inhibit the enrollment, attendance, or school success of homeless children.

Homeless students will be provided services comparable to other students in the District including:

- transportation services;
- educational services for which the homeless student meets eligibility criteria including services provided under Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act or similar State and local programs, educational programs for children with disabilities, and educational programs for students with limited English proficiency;
- programs in vocational and technical education;
- programs for gifted and talented students; and
- school nutrition programs.

Student Records and Directory Information

In order to provide students with appropriate instruction and educational services it is necessary for the District to maintain extensive educational and personal information. It is essential that pertinent information in these records be readily available to appropriate school personnel, be accessible to the student’s parent(s) or the student in compliance with law, and yet be guarded as confidential information.

The Guidance Counselor is responsible for the proper administration of student records in keeping with Ohio Law and Federal requirements and the procedures for the collection of necessary information about individual students throughout the District.

Upon request, all records and files included in student’s cumulative file are available to parent(s) or the student (if he/she is over eighteen years of age). This request must be in writing and is granted within even calendar days. No records are to be removed from the school; principal, teacher or other qualified school personnel must be present to explain an of the tests or other material.

All rights and protections given to parents under law and this policy transfer to the student when he/she reaches age eighteen or enrolls in post secondary school. The student then becomes an “eligible student”.

The District provides notice to parents and eligible student annually, in accordance with the procedures set forth under administrative regulations, of the rights held by parents and eligible students under law and this policy. It is the intent of the District to limit the disclosure of information contained in the student’s education records except by prior written consent, as directory information, and under other limited circumstances as enumerated under administrative regulations.

The following rights exists:

- the right to inspect and review the student’s education records;
- the right, in accordance with administrative regulations to seek to correct parts of the student’s education records, including the right to a hearing if the school authority decides not to alter the records according to the parent(s) or eligible student’s request;
- the right of any person to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education if the District violates relevant Federal law, specifically the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA); and
- the right to acquire information concerning the procedure which the parent(s) or eligible student should follow to obtain copies of this policy, the locations from which copies may be obtained, as well as any fees to be charged for such copies.

The District proposes to designate the following personally identifiable information contained in a student’s education records as “directory information”

- ◆ Student’s name;
- ◆ Student’s address;
- ◆ Student’s photograph;
- ◆ Student’s date of birth;
- ◆ Student’s extracurricular participation; and
- ◆ Student’s weight and height, if a member of an athletic team.

The above information is disclosed without prior written consent, except when the request is for a profit-making plan or activity.

Administrative regulations set forth a procedure for annual notification to parents and eligible students of the District’s definition of directory information. Parents or eligible students then have two weeks in which to advise the District, in accordance with such regulations of any or all items which they refuse to permit as directory information about that student.

To carry out their responsibilities, school officials have access to student education records for legitimate education purposes. The District uses the criteria set forth under administrative regulations to determine who are “school officials” and what constitutes “legitimate educational interests:

Other than requests as described above, school officials release information from or permit access to, a student’s education records only with the prior written consent of a parent or eligible student except that the Superintendent or a person designated in writing by the Superintendent may permit disclosure in certain limited circumstances outlined under administrative regulations (e.g., transfers to another school district or to comply with judicial order or subpoena or were warranted, in a health or safety emergency, etc.).

The District maintains, in accordance with administrative regulations, an accurate record of all request to disclose information from, or to permit access to, a student’s education records and of information disclosed and access permitted.
