#### Superintendent's Report

Another school year is on the horizon. Our major summer projects are drawing to a close with us eagerly anticipating their use. Along with these projects, we had the gymnasium cleaned and a fresh coat of paint on the walls. You can also expect new signage in the gymnasium. Summer cleaning is starting to wrap up along with the addition of new interactive technology in the Elementary rooms. The junior and senior high classrooms are being scheduled for next summer. In addition, we are hoping to upgrade the front driveway and repave the back. When we are able to get this done, it will make our oldest driving surface seven years old. Currently, we have surfaces that are 10-15 years old. In this edition of the Update, we have placed a site plan which was developed based on our needs identified in the strategic plan process. When you reference it, note that Phase I which is the front entrance and the greenhouse will be completed in the coming weeks. Phase II is a large project, but will make way for Phases III and IV. In Phase II, this building will increase efficiency in our general operations. Regarding other facility items associated with the plan, we continue to pursue options to purchase ground and upgrade our HVAC in our buildings.



#### Reminder From the Transportation Department

#### SAFE RIDE TO SCHOOL RULES!

- Students must respectfully obey the driver
- Students should be ready to board the bus 5 minutes before the bus is expected to arrive.
- Students must stay properly seated at all times, keeping aisles and exits clear.
- Students may only bring articles on the bus that they can hold in their lap.
- Students must use only their assigned bus stop.
- Students must be quiet at RR tracks until the bus is completely across the tracks
- There is to be no cell phone use of any kind.
- There is no eating or drinking on the buses.
- Students cannot change buses except for emergencies.
- Students are to observe classroom like behavior on the bus
- Students may lose their bus riding privileges if the above rules are not followed!

#### Welcome Back!

I hope you are having a fantastic summer, taking time to relax and recharge for the upcoming school year. I am thrilled to have you as part of our wonderful learning community. Your positive energy and commitment to educational excellence are truly valued, and I look forward to collaborating with you and your child(ren).

#### **New Staff and Updates**

Each year brings exciting changes and new faces to our district. We have made some updates to the campus, including a new front entrance and greenhouse. We are also pleased to welcome Courtney Risner and Ben Clark to our team!

Mrs. Risner joins us from Arlington, where she served as the lower elementary Intervention Specialist. She will be our new 4-6 Intervention Specialist, taking over for Ms. Hill, who will be transitioning to 3rd grade to replace Ms. Snyder. Mr. Clark comes to Arcadia from Florida, where he was honored with the Crystal Apple Teacher of the Year award in 2018-2019. He will be stepping in for Mrs. Morehart in 3rd grade.

We are excited to introduce a new Language Arts curriculum for grades K-5. We have updated our previous 2017 Wonders materials to the latest 2023 Wonders materials, which align with the Science of Reading. These updates will help us meet the State's requirements for High-Quality Instructional Materials and better serve our students' needs. Additionally, all staff have received training in Dyslexia and the Science of Reading for grades K-6. This year, we will also be identifying a new math curriculum to implement in the 2025-2026 school year.

As we did last year, we will stagger the start for Kindergarten. Half of each class will attend during the first two days of school, with all students present the last two days of the week. Information about your child's start date and any other necessary details will be shared through Final Forms.

If you haven't updated your Final Forms, please do so before school begins. Any changes to your address, phone number, etc., need to be made in this system. Keeping this information current is crucial for ensuring your child's safety. If you have any questions, feel free to contact the office for assistance or to be connected with the appropriate person.

#### **Open House**

Our open house will be held on August 22nd from 4:00-6:00 PM. This change accommodates the Hancock County Fair's earlier move-in date. You will have the opportunity to bring your school supplies, meet your child's teacher (class lists will be posted outside classrooms), set up cafeteria accounts, learn about your child's bus route, and submit any necessary medication/forms.

Staff will be available to greet parents on the West side of the building (under the red overhang) and will help direct you to the right areas. We will have signs in the hallways to guide new families to the appropriate educational wing, making it a smoother experience for everyone.

Additionally, there will be a "party at the park" for families from 4:00-7:00 PM at the Arcadia Community Park and Lion's Building. This event will provide access to various community resources and a chance to connect with others before the school year begins. A big thank you to the Arcadia PTA and ARC Heart & Soul for organizing this fun event.

#### **Student Classroom Placements**

A great deal of thought and effort has gone into placing students for the 2024-2025 school year. We have worked to balance classrooms academically and socially to enhance student learning. Adjusting placements can be challenging without disrupting the balance within each classroom. Please know that careful consideration was given to your child's homeroom assignment. It may take a few weeks for students to adapt to their new grade, classmates and teacher. If your child is having difficulty with the transition, please reach out to our school counselor, Ms. Harmon, who is available to support you and your child(ren).



## **PreK-12 Notification System**

Arcadia School will once again use the school-to-family communications service called **PreK-12 Notification**. We will use this service to deliver both emergency and non-emergency messages to you via telephone for 2024-2025 school year. Using PreK-12 Notification, we can quickly contact all families - in a matter of minutes - with urgent news such as school closings, early dismissals, delayed buses or rescheduled activities. We will also use the service to provide timely non-emergency information such as reminders about important meetings or special events at school that involve your children. In the case of school closings, this service is meant to be a compliment to the existing means of communications, TV stations, radio stations, etc. We will continue to utilize ALL of these mediums in the event of a school closure and/or delay.

Your primary phone number will be supplied to PreK - 12 Notification Service. Each family may add up to four telephone numbers. In the case of an emergency, the

message will be delivered to all numbers listed.

Families that wish to include additional phone numbers may do so by calling the PreK-12 Notification Parent Hotline at 1-800-846-4976. For security reasons, you must call from your primary phone number to manage your personal emergency contact list.

# Please verify that your information on file with PreK-12 Notification is correct.

#### **HOMELESS STUDENTS**

Children who meet the Federal definition of "homeless" will be provided a free and appropriate public education in the same manner as all other students of the District. To that end, homeless students will not be stigmatized or segregated on the basis of their status as homeless and will be assigned to the school serving those non-homeless students residing in the area in which the homeless child is actually living. No homeless student will be denied enrollment based on a lack of proof of residency. No Board policy, administrative guideline, or practice will be interpreted or applied in such a way as to inhibit the enrollment, attendance, or school success of homeless children.

Homeless students will be provided services comparable to other students in the District including:

- transportation services:
- educational services for which the homeless student meets eligibility criteria including services provided under Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act or similar State and local programs, educational programs for children with disabilities, and educational programs for students with limited English proficiency;
- programs in vocational and technical education;
- programs for gifted and talented students; and
- school nutrition programs.

#### Search for Children with Disabilities

School districts across the state of Ohio are participating in an effort to identify, locate, and evaluate all children from birth through twenty-one years of age who may have disabilities. Disability, in this instance, means such conditions as hearing impairments, speech or language impairments, visual impairments, specific learning disabilities, multiple disabilities, mental retardation, emotionally disturbed, other health impairments, autism, traumatic brain injury, and physical impairments.

Public schools have responded vigorously to federal and state mandates requiring the provision of a free appropriate public education regardless of a child's disability. But before school districts can serve children, they must be found. Many children with disabilities are not visible because they do not function in the mainstream of the community, such as children who are homeless and children of migrant families. Also, many unidentified children with disabilities are preschoolers. Parents may not be aware their child has a disability or that there are programs and services available.

The school district will ask for information about the child, asking such questions as: What is the problem? What has already been done about the problem? What background information is available? This information may be collected in several ways including interviews, observations, screening, and testing. This information may be obtained from parents and the student, or from other agencies that have information about the student. This information will be used to decide whether the child has a disability and needs special services.

All information collected will be held in strict confidence and released to others only with parent permission or as allowed by law. For example, the school district will send records on request to a school district or other educational agency in which a student intends to enroll. The parents may have a copy of those records upon request.

The school district will keep a record of all persons who review confidential records with the exception of authorized school employees, or other educational agency personnel. The school will also maintain a list of those employees who may have access to records.

The school district or other educational agency will inform the parents when personally identifiable information collected, maintained, or used is no longer needed to provide educational services to the child. All personally identifiable data will be kept for at least five years or longer if required for audit purposes, or otherwise required by law.

Parents and students have rights in this process. Parents have the right to:

- Review their child's records;
- Refuse permission to release information (except as required by or permitted by, law to be released); and
- Request that information they believe to be inaccurate, misleading, or in violation of their child's privacy or other rights be changed. The district has a process to resolve disagreements about information collected.

The school district has appointed one person to make sure that information about students is kept confidential. Contact your school district board of education office for this person's name. The school district's policies and procedures for special education are available. Contact the school district superintendent.

The school district operates an Educational Management Information System (EMIS) that assures a practical method of identifying which children are currently receiving special education services and which children are not. Certain data regarding children are maintained within this system. School districts are interested in meeting the needs of children with disabilities. If you have or know of a child who may have a disability, contact your local school for more information and help.

#### **IDEA-B FUNDS**

The Arcadia Local Schools will once again be receiving Title VI-B Funds for the 2024-2025 year.

This allocation is earmarked to help pay for the special education services Arcadia students receive through the Hancock County Educational Service Center. The school system would like to continue to use its IDEA-B money for this purpose.

#### **Student Records and Directory Information**

In order to provide students with appropriate instruction and educational services it is necessary for the District to maintain extensive educational and personal information. It is essential that pertinent information in these records be readily available to appropriate school personnel, be accessible to the student's parent(s) or the student in compliance with law, and yet be guarded as confidential information.

The Guidance Counselor is responsible for the proper administration of student records in keeping with Ohio Law and Federal requirements and the procedures for the collection of necessary information about individual students throughout the District.

Upon request, all records and files included in student's cumulative file are available to parent(s) or the student (if he/she is over eighteen years of age). This request must be in writing and is granted within even calendar days. No records are to be removed from the school; principal, teacher or other qualified school personnel must be present to explain an of the tests or other material.

All rights and protections given to parents under law and this policy transfer to the student when he/she reaches age eighteen or enrolls in post secondary school. The student then becomes an "eligible student".

The District provides notice to parents and eligible student annually, in accordance with the procedures set forth under administrative regulations, of the rights held by parents and eligible students under law and this policy. It is the intent of the District to limit the disclosure of information contained in the student's education records except by prior written consent, as directory information, and under other limited circumstances as enumerated under administrative regulations.

The following rights exists:

- the right to inspect and review the student's education records;
- the right, in accordance with administrative regulations to seek to correct parts of the student's education records, including
  the right to a hearing if the school authority decides not to alter the records according to the parent(s) or eligible student's
  request;
- the right of any person to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education if the District violates relevant Federal law, specifically the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA); and
- the right to acquire information concerning the procedure which the parent(s) or eligible student should follow to obtain copies of this policy, the locations from which copies may be obtained, as well as any fees to be charged for such copies.

The District proposes to designate the following personally identifiable information contained in a student's education records as "directory information"

- Student's name;
- Student's address;
- Student's photograph;
- Student's date of birth;
- Student's extracurricular participation; and
- Student's weight and height, if a member of an athletic team.

The above information is disclosed without prior written consent, except when the request is for a profit-making plan or activity.

Administrative regulations set forth a procedure for annual notification to parents and eligible students of the District's definition of directory information. Parents or eligible students then have two weeks in which to advise the District, in accordance with such regulations of any or all items which they refuse to permit as directory information about that student.

To carry out their responsibilities, school officials have access to student education records for legitimate education purposes. The District uses the criteria set forth under administrative regulations to determine who are "school officials" and what constitutes "legitimate educational interests:

Other than requests as described above, school officials release information from or permit access to, a student's education records only with the prior written consent of a parent or eligible student except that the Superintendent or a person designated in writing by the Superintendent may permit disclosure in certain limited circumstances outlined under administrative regulations (e.g., transfers to another school district or to comply with judicial order or subpoena or were warranted, in a health or safety emergency, etc.).

The District maintains, in accordance with administrative regulations, an accurate record of all request to disclose information from, or to permit access to, a student's education records and of information disclosed and access permitted.
